Students are supported through remedial coaching classes and mentoring. Final year students are provided with mentoring from passed out students/Alumni to help them analyze job profiles and career option after completion of their B.Ed. Cleanliness drive is organized to create awareness and motivation among students to keep the environment clean.






